What Time Do You Put Your Recycling Out At The Curb?

The Solid Waste Authority has always encouraged residents to place their recycling at the curb by 7:00 am on their collection day. The Authority would like to take this opportunity to remind everybody how important this is. The recycling crew has a log which contains each customer's name and address. As they perform the daily collection route, the log is used to check-off each customer's name as they proceed down the street. If a customer's recycling box is not at the curb when they drive by, the log will reflect that.

In addition, please do not assume that because your recycling was picked up at 10 am for the past month that it will always be picked up at 10 am. We have different drivers who do the collection routes differently, so the times may not always be the same. Please help us out with this issue. If you have questions please contact us at 769-6977.

The Convenience of Curbside Recycling

Have you considered the convenience of curbside recycling? The Authority will stop by your home every two (2) weeks and pick up your recyclables for a nominal fee of \$30 per year, which works out to \$2.50 per month. Recycling should help to reduce your garbage bills and minimize those trips to the county recycling drop-off sites. We currently have curbside collection programs in Flemington, Mill Hall, Avis, Woolrich, Dunnstown, Castanea, McElhattan, Beech Creek and Renovo Areas.

The Authority is under contract with the City of Lock Haven to provide this service to city residents. If you live in the City, please continue to put your recyclables out on your curbside on the regularly scheduled dates.

When you subscribe to this convenient service you will be given a "blue box" to place your recyclables in. The materials we collect include: aluminum & tin cans, clear/brown/green glass bottles & jars, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, and plastic bottles and jugs.

All of the materials can be placed in the blue box as noted in the directions. It is that simple!!! Please feel free to call us with any questions you may have.

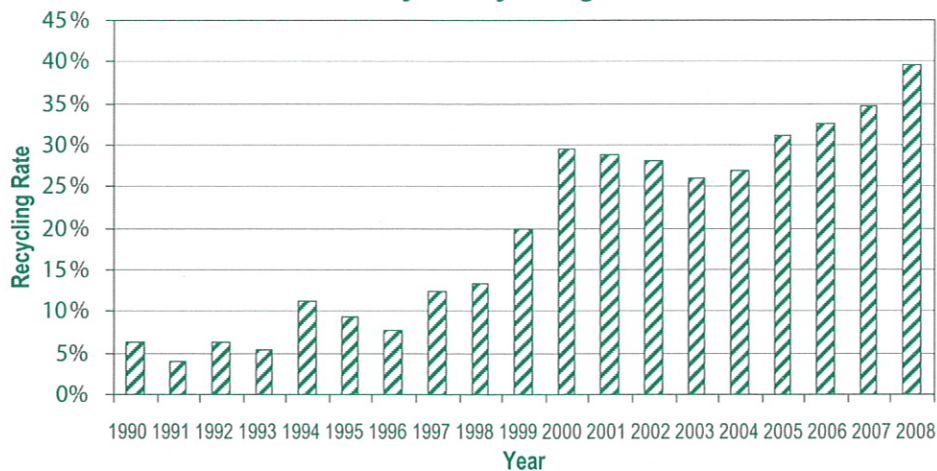
Clinton County Recycling on the Rise!

Every year the Clinton County Solid Waste Authority collects recycling data from businesses, industries, and institutions throughout Clinton County. This information is then added to the recycling data from the Authority's countywide recycling program, resulting in a "County" recycling rate. During 2008 over 15,900 tons of various types of materials were recycled. This number can be broken down into three major categories:

1. Curbside Recycling: 971 tons
2. Drop-Off Recycling: 3,774 tons
3. Business, Industrial, and Institutional Recycling: 11,182 tons

When comparing the 15,900 tons of recyclables to the amount of municipal solid waste generated in the county, a recycling rate of 39.7% was achieved. As shown on the chart below, recycling in Clinton County is certainly on the rise!

Christmas Tree Recycling

What will you do with your Christmas tree after the Holiday Season? The Authority would like to encourage Clinton County residents to reuse and/or recycle real Christmas trees.

To reuse a Christmas tree, place it outside and use it as a natural bird feeder and at the same time it will provide shelter for not only birds, but rabbits, squirrels and chipmunks as well. After a while it can be dropped off at the landfill for free. Your tree will be turned into mulch, which can provide protection to other plants during the cold harsh weather and provide nutrients and moisture during the long hot summer.

Just a reminder, brush and yard material, excluding grass clippings, is accepted at the landfill free of charge all year long. All we ask is for residents to stop at the office and sign in so we know you are on site and then sign out before you leave.

So please reconsider before throwing out this years Christmas tree, it could be put to good use. If you have questions about how to recycle your Christmas tree please call us.

Commercial Recycling



The Authority has developed a flexible and cost effective recycling program to meet the needs of commercial and institutional establishments within the county. These types of establishments located within the City of Lock Haven are required by state law and city ordinance to recycle, at a minimum, high-grade office paper, corrugated cardboard, aluminum, clear/colored glass and steel/bi-metal cans. The Authority can help design a recycling program to satisfy these requirements.

REMINDERS

- **Mulch** – The Wayne Township Landfill continues to sell landscape mulch. Wayne Township Residents are allowed to receive up to 10 yards free with proof of residency.
- **Tours** – Tours of the landfill and recycling center are typically 1.5 to 2 hours long. If your group would like to schedule a tour please contact us at 570-769-6977 to make a reservation.
- **Electronic Recycling** – We accept various types of electronic equipment at our recycling center in Wayne Township. For a complete listing of the materials we accept visit our website or give us a call.

Clinton County Recycling Facts

The following is a list of materials and amounts recycled through the Authority's Recycling Facility:

Corrugated Cardboard	1.3 million pounds
Glass Bottles	1.1 million pounds
Newspaper	948,000 pounds
Tin Cans	194,000 pounds
Mixed Paper	654,000 pounds
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	402,000 pounds

Recycling 1 ton of paper saves 3.3 cubic yards of landfill space; recycling 1 ton of plastic saves 7.4 cubic yards of landfill space; and recycling 1 ton of corrugated cardboard saves 9 cubic yards of landfill space. In 2008 the Solid Waste Authority collected and recycled 327 tons of paper, 201 tons of plastic bottles and jugs and 665 tons of corrugated cardboard. This means we saved 8,551 cubic yards of landfill space, which is equal to 5.9% of the space we typically use in a year's time. This also doesn't calculate in tin cans, glass bottles, newspaper or other specialty items that we recycle every day.

Wayne Township Landfill Redevelopment

Planning for the future of Clinton County's solid waste needs is a large part of what the Solid Waste Authority works towards on a daily basis. Trying to accomplish this, while being competitive in the solid waste industry, is a difficult task. We are currently working on a plan to redevelop our closed landfill located within our current property boundary in Wayne Township.

The project will entail removing the trash from the unlined landfill and installing a state of the art liner system, similar to what has been constructed for our active landfill. Redevelopment of the closed landfill will create approximately 30 more years of disposal capacity to meet the area's solid waste needs. We submitted a permit modification application to the PaDEP on November 30, 2007. The PaDEP is presently reviewing the environmental assessment for the project. We are anticipating that this stage of the process will be completed before the end of 2009. Once complete, the Department will begin their technical review phase of the project. If everything goes as planned, the Authority should receive the requested permit by the fall of 2010.

We will keep the community updated as we progress in our mission to continue to be the long-term economical solution to the area's waste needs. Throughout this process, and in our everyday operations, we will stick to our motto:

Clinton County Recycling Directions

The following materials are collected and recycled in Clinton County: clear, green, and brown glass bottles & jars; newspaper; mixed paper; corrugated cardboard; aluminum, steel, and tin cans; and plastic bottles. The materials are collected by our curbside collection or drop-off collection programs. The table below identifies the materials and how to prepare them for recycling.

Please follow these directions and the directions posted at each drop-off site. If an item you have is not on this list dispose of it properly. If you are not sure please call us at 570-769-6977.

MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED	HOW TO PREPARE FOR RECYCLING	WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED
Glass Bottles & Jars	Clear, brown, and green glass bottles & jars.	Rinse containers, remove lids, leave labels on.	Window glass, light bulbs, crystal, Pyrex, ceramics, ovenware, & drinking glasses.
Newspaper	Clean Newspaper (including inserts).	Separate from mixed paper.	Phone books.
Mixed Paper	Office paper, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, glossy paper.	Separate from newspaper.	Phone books, coated paper, tissue paper, hard-backed books.
Corrugated Cardboard	Clean corrugated cardboard.	Breakdown boxes.	Cereal boxes, six-pack carriers, waxed cardboard.
Cans	Aluminum, steel, & tin food and beverage cans.	Rinse containers, leave labels on.	Pie plates, aluminum foil, pesticide or herbicide spray cans.
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Plastic bottles, coded #1 or #2, typically soda, milk, water, & laundry soap bottles.	Rinse containers, remove lids, leave labels on.	Toys, plastic bottles coded #3 thru #7, motor oil bottles, other plastic containers.

COLLECTION INSTRUCTIONS

- Please rinse all containers and remove lids.
- Place newspaper and magazines/junk mail into **separate** plastic bags.
- Place at curbside by **7:00am** on day of scheduled pick up.
- If your collection day falls on a holiday your pickup will be the **next business day**.
