Recycling Collection Guidelines

If someone in your household has been sick, is quarantined or has tested positive for COVID-19, please hold your recycling at home for one week before placing it at the curb or at one of our recycling drop-off sites.

Thank you all for your patience during this time, as we strive to keep our employees and customers safe and healthy.



To Tarp or Not To Tarp?

According to Pennsylvania's waste regulations, in order to prevent scattering of litter on the highway, vehicles transporting loose garbage, waste, refuse or rubbish must be transported in a vehicle with four solid sides and with a cover or a top to prevent the load from escaping.

- If loose material is being hauled in an open vehicle, the load must be tarped.
- If material being hauled is in tied bags, but the bags extend above the side walls, it must be tarped.
- Bulky items that are not completely contained within the sidewalls of the vehicles must be strapped down or tarped.
- If the tarp is torn or not adequately tied, the load is not considered secure.
- When in doubt, tarp!



Clinton County Residential Tire Collection Event

On September 11th and 12th the Authority held another Tire Collection Event. In addition to Clinton County residents, ten municipalities from Lycoming County were also invited to participate. The event was very successful. Over 500 residents participated. The event collected over 5,300 tires, bringing the total number of tires collected since 2003 to nearly 92,000 tires! Thank you to everyone who helped make this event a success.

Plastic Bag Recycling Reminder

If you use plastic bags to shuffle your recyclables to the drop-off site, please empty your recyclables out of the plastic bag and take the bag with you. Curbside Recycling: An Overview



Below you will find a table that describes what we collect via our curbside recycling program. The table also outlines how to prepare the material for recycling and what materials are not accepted. MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED	HOW TO PREPARE FOR RECYCLING	WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED
Newspaper	Clean newspaper (including in- serts).	Separate from mixed paper.	Wet or dirty newspaper.
Mixed Paper	Office paper, junk mail, phone books, magazines, catalogs, glossy paper.	Separate from newspaper.	Laminated or coated paper, tissue paper and paper towels.
Paperboard	Clean food boxes, paper towel rolls, shoe boxes, tissue boxes.	Include with mixed paper.	Milk cartons, juice cartons, ice cream containers and similar materials.
Cans	Aluminum, steel, & tin food and beverage cans.	Rinse, leave labels on.	Pie plates, aluminum foil, pesticide or herbicide spray cans.
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Plastic bottles & jugs, coded #1 - #7	Rinse, remove lids, leave labels on.	Toys, motor oil or chemical bottles.

Curbside Recycling Collection Notes:

- Recycling material should be placed at the curb by 7:00 am on the day of your scheduled pick-up.
- If you put out more recycling than fits in your blue or green recycling bin, please mark it "Recycling".
- If your pick-up day falls on a major holiday, your recycling material will be picked up on the next business day.

Curbside Recycling Application

Have you considered the convenience of curbside recycling? The Authority will stop by your home every two (2) weeks and pick up your recyclables for a nominal **annual fee of \$51** (\$4.25 per month). Please note that the Authority did not implement a planned fee increase for 2021 due to COVID19.

The materials we collect include: aluminum & tin cans, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, paperboard and plastic bottles & jugs. (The Authority is under contract with the City of Lock Haven to provide this service to city residents. If you live in the City, please continue to put your recyclables out on your curbside on the regularly scheduled dates. If you need a collection box, call City Hall at 570-893-5900.)

20th Annual John B. Hoy, Jr. Memorial Charity Golf Tournament

The Wayne Twp. Landfill (WTL), which is owned and operated by the Clinton County Solid Waste Authority (CCSWA), recently held their 20th Annual John B. Hoy, Jr. Memorial Charity Golf Tournament at the Clinton Country Club. This tournament has raised over \$165,000 in the past 19 years, with each tournament benefitting 2-3 non-profit organizations in Clinton County. This year, the CCSWA Board of Directors decided to pick just one organization to be the beneficiary, with the idea that more money given to one organization would have a larger impact in helping our community.

This year's recipient was the **Salvation Army's Kids Café Children's Program**. The program offers an afterschool program for the underserved children in Lock Haven, providing tutoring, reading, character building activities and a healthy meal. This also allows The Salvation Army to assess the needs of the participating families and offer help through its other programs.

This year, the total raised for the Salvation Army was \$19,074. A special thank you goes out to Highway Equipment & Supply Company and Ryan Flood-Owner, for being our Platinum sponsor, and for also adding a last minute donation challenge that raised \$4,000 just before tee-off.
