Mulch Season!



It's the time of year when we all want to get outside and get our yards cleaned up and looking nice for the summer. So we wanted to talk to you about our mulch process so you can make informed decisions about the mulch you choose for your land-scaping needs. The Authority is the foremost producer of mulch for Clinton County and surroundings areas. We offer three colors of mulch, dyed brown, dyed black and natural. Our mulch is double ground to insure the pristine landscaping look and attributes that mulch should have.

The natural mulch is produced from recycled materials brought into our facility free of charge. These materials include, brush and yard waste along with clean wood (no paint/no stain/no treatment). Once we receive the material we grind it and place it in piles approximately 50 feet wide and 20 feet high. When the pile is fully established, we saturate the pile with fresh water. As the water trickles through the pile it leaches out the tannins in the wood, turning the water dark brown. The water is then collected and recirculated back through the pile. As this water is recirculated it naturally turns the mulch dark brown.

The mulch piles must also be turned throughout the composting process. At least once a month the mulch piles are turned and possibly more often if it appears the material is composting faster. After the mulch has composted to the desired consistency, the pile must then meet temperature requirements. At this point, the piles are required to maintain a temperature of between 113-140 degrees Fahrenheit for a minimum of 72 hours. This temperature requirement assures that weed seeds, fungus and molds, which naturally occur in the wood, are destroyed. Once all of these requirements are met the mulch is ground a second time and is now ready to be sold.

The dyed brown and dyed black mulch are produced from pallet material because the wood is already dried. The material is ground and dyed. Then it sits for 3 days to allow for color adherence. The mulch is then ground and dyed again. The dye is a biodegradable water based dye, therefore it is not harmful to the plants in your garden or landscape.

Plastic Bag Recycling Reminder

If you use plastic bags to shuffle your recyclables to the drop-off site, please empty your recyclables out of the plastic bag and take the bag with you. Curbside Recycling: An Overview



Below you will find a table that describes what we collect via our curbside recycling program. The table also outlines how to prepare the material for recycling and what materials are not accepted. Newspaper	Clean newspaper (including in- serts).	Separate from mixed paper.	Wet or dirty newspaper.
Mixed Paper	Office paper, junk mail, phone books, magazines, catalogs, glossy paper.	Separate from newspaper.	Laminated or coated paper, tissue paper and paper towels.
Paperboard	Clean food boxes, paper towel rolls, shoe boxes, tissue boxes.	Include with mixed paper.	Milk cartons, juice cartons, ice cream containers and similar materials.
Cans	Aluminum, steel, & tin food and beverage cans.	Rinse, leave labels on.	Pie plates, aluminum foil, pesticide or herbicide spray cans.
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Plastic bottles & jugs, coded #1 - #7	Rinse, remove lids, leave labels on.	Toys, motor oil or chemical bottles.

Curbside Recycling Collection Notes:

- Recycling material should be placed at the curb by 7:00 am on the day of your scheduled pick-up.
- If you put out more recycling than fits in your blue or green recycling bin, please mark it "Recycling".
- If your pick-up day falls on a major holiday, your recycling material will be picked up on the next business day.

Curbside Recycling Application

Have you considered the convenience of curbside recycling? The Authority will stop by your home every two (2) weeks and pick up your recyclables for a nominal **annual fee of \$60** (\$5.00 per month). Annual fee will be prorated based on service start time.

The materials we collect include: aluminum & tin cans, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, paperboard and plastic bottles & jugs. (The Authority is under contract with the City of Lock Haven to provide this service to city residents. If you live in the City, please continue to put your recyclables out on your curbside on the regularly scheduled dates. If you need a recycling bin, call City Hall at 570-893-5900.)

Recycling Opportunities for Lock Haven Residents

Working closely with Wayne Township Landfill, the City of Lock Haven is pleased to be able to offer FREE curbside recycling to all City Residents. Lock Haven has three separate collection zones, with pick up days every other Friday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, depending on the collection zone. Materials that can be collected in your curbside recycling bin include: Paper (Newsprint, junk mail, magazines, office paper, and paper board), Aluminum beverage containers, Plastics bottles & jugs, number 1-7, and steel/tin food and beverage containers. Please remember to keep your newsprint separate from the other types of paper. Magnets with the recycling schedule will be distributed at the beginning of each year in your recycling bins on your scheduled pickup day. If you don't get a magnet or need an additional magnet, please stop in City Hall to pick one up. In addition to magnets, any City resident can pick up a recycling bin at City Hall, 20 E Church St, between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

If you miss your collection day, don't worry! In addition to curbside pickup, residents can take recycling to the Myrtle Street Recycling Drop-Off Center, located at 100 Myrtle Street. In addition to the materials listed above, residents can drop off clean corrugated cardboard at the Myrtle Street Recycling Center. Glass <u>IS NOT</u> accepted for recycling.

2022 Clinton County Residential Tire Collection Event

- The cost for using WTL Self-Dump is \$25 for a single load and \$40 for a double or oversize load. Please remember to tarp and secure your load.
- Are you ready for some DIY landscaping? Our #1 regular mulch is \$22 per yard. Want a little color in your yard? Choose dyed black or brown mulch for \$28 per yard. Call our office for delivery options.
- We accept tires at the landfill everyday. The cost is \$3.00 per car/light truck tire for Clinton County residents.
- City of Lock haven has an ordinance which requires all commercial entities to recycle at least 3 materials. Please contact us to get set up. We have a program to fit your budget.
