## Curbside Recycling Program



Below you will find a table that describes what we collect via our curbside recycling program. The table also outlines how to prepare the material for recycling and what materials are not accepted.

MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED	HOW TO PREPARE FOR RECYCLING	WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED
Newspaper	Clean newspaper (including inserts).	Separate from mixed paper.	Wet or dirty newspaper.
Mixed Paper	Office paper, junk mail, phone books, magazines, catalogs, glossy paper.	Separate from newspaper.	Laminated paper and tissue paper.
Paperboard	Clean food boxes, paper towel rolls, shoe boxes, tissue boxes.	Include with mixed paper.	Wax coated food boxes, juice cartons, ice cream containers.
Cans	Aluminum & tin food and beverage cans.	Rinse, leave labels on.	Pie plates, aluminum foil, pesticide or herbicide spray cans.
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Plastic bottles, coded #1 thru #7, less than 1 gallon in size.	Rinse, remove lids, leave labels on.	Containers greater than 1 gallon, toys, motor oil bottles, laundry baskets, chairs.

### Recycling Collection Notes:

- ◆ Recycling material should be placed at the curb by 7:00 am on the day of your scheduled pick-up.
- ◆ If you put out more recycling than fits in your blue or green recycling bin, you must mark it "Recycling".
- ◆ If your pick-up day falls on a major holiday, your recycling material will be picked up on the next business day.

## Curbside Recycling Application

Have you considered the convenience of curbside recycling? The Authority will stop by your home every two (2) weeks and pick up your recyclables for a nominal **annual fee of \$42** (\$3.50 per month). The materials we collect include: aluminum & tin cans, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, paperboard and plastic containers (< 1 gallon in size). (The Authority is under contract with the City of Lock Haven to provide this service to city residents. If you live in the City, please continue to put your recyclables out on your curbside on the regularly scheduled dates. If you need a collection bin, call City Hall at 570-893-5900.)

## Commercial/Industrial Recycling in Clinton County

Do you have a commercial or industrial establishment located in Clinton County? If so, you are eligible to participate in our Commercial Recycling Program. The Authority has a flexible and cost effective recycling program to meet the needs of every establishment. We currently offer the following recycling options:

- 65 gallon wheeled carts, serviced weekly.
- 65 gallons wheeled carts, serviced bi-weekly.
- Blue Box, serviced bi-weekly.
- Roll-off containers, serviced as needed.

Our recycling carts are labeled for your convenience and have wheels to make them easy to move when full. Please feel to give us a call so we can help you with your recycling needs.

Commercial establishments within the City of Lock Haven are required by state law and city ordinance to recycle a minimum of three of the listed materials. Please contact us to get set up.

### “Slow Down to Get Around” Campaign



WTL has joined the “Slow Down to Get Around” national safety campaign. The campaign is aimed at reminding motorists to drive carefully around recycling and waste collection vehicles. Some states have initiated “Slow Down to Get Around” legislature.

WTL has taken the initiative to place “Slow Down to Get Around” decals on their recycling and over the road trucks to assist in spreading the word. According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics, waste and recycling material collection was the 5<sup>th</sup> most dangerous occupation in the US for 2013 and 2014.

"It's about helping motorists think of garbage trucks like they're school buses," Solid Waste Association of North America's CEO David Biderman stated. "Every time you drive near a school bus and it stops and the red light goes on, you think 'Oh, I've got to stop, there's a kid around.' We want people to treat garbage trucks the same way because there's a guy around. Somebody's father or somebody's son or somebody's husband."

### Clinton County Residential Tire Collection Event



The Authority held another Tire Collection Event during the month of May. We extended an invitation to 10 neighboring municipalities from Lycoming County to participate. The event was very successful. Residents from 25 of 29 Clinton County municipalities participated with over 340 vehicles delivering tires. The event collected 4,914 tires, bringing the total number of tires collected since 2003 to over 71,000 tires!

  - ◆ Clinton County residents can bring Freon containing appliances to the WTL free of charge.
  - ◆ Brush & Yard Waste can be brought to our mulch facility free of charge. Then on your way out purchase a load of landscape mulch. Natural Double Ground is \$22.00 per yard and the colored (brown and black) is \$28.00 per yard.
