Electronics Recycling



Certain types of electronic devices have been banned from landfill disposal by the **Pa Department of Environmental Protection.** The affected devices are listed below:

Televisions
Computer Monitors
Computer Towers/Laptops/Tablets
Printers/Scanners
Computer Peripherals (e.g., keyboards, mice, computer speakers)

The Solid Waste Authority has a program in place for County residents to drop-off these items for recycling, but starting on January 1, 2018 this service will no longer be provided at no charge due to rising operational costs associated with recycling these electronic devices.

In addition, the material will no longer be accepted at the Authority's Recycling Center on Pine Mountain Road, in Wayne Township. Anyone wishing to recycle their "banned" electronic devices will need to deliver the material to the Landfill weigh station located at the end of Landfill Lane. The banned material fees are outlined below:

Televisions - \$20 each
Computer Monitors - \$20 each
Computers Towers/Laptops/Tablets - \$10 each
Printers/Scanners - \$10 each

International SWANA Road-e-o Winners

Plastic Bottle and Jug Recycling

As most of you know the Authority expanded the plastic bottles and jugs recycling program to include bottles and jugs coded #1 through #7's. These types of containers must be a gallon or less in size to be placed out for the curbside recycling program. If you have plastic bottles and jugs that are larger than 1 gallon in size, you can take those containers to one of our many recycling drop-off sites located throughout the county.

We also wanted to take this opportunity to remind residents that there are plastic items that may be coded correctly, but do not meet the bottle or jug criteria, such as:

- clam shell 'polystyrene' containers which restaurants use for takeout
- black plastic flower pots
- laundry baskets
- lawn chairs
- toys of any size
- plastic bags
- motor oil & pesticide containers

If you use plastic bags to shuffle your recyclables to the drop site, please empty your recyclables out of the plastic bag and take the bag with you. Plastic bags can be recycled at several large grocery stores in the County. If you have questions regarding our plastics recycling program, please feel free to call us.

To Tarp or Not To Tarp?



According to Pennsylvania's waste regulations, in order to prevent scattering of litter on the highway, vehicles transporting loose garbage, waste, refuse or rubbish must be transported in a vehicle with four solid sides and with a cover or a top to prevent the load from escaping.

- If loose material is being hauled in an open vehicle, the load must be tarped.
- If material being hauled is in tied bags, but the bags extend above the side walls, it must be tarped.
- Bulky items that are not completely contained within the sidewalls of the vehicles must be strapped down or tarped.
- If the tarp is torn or not adequately tied, the load is not considered secure.
- When in doubt, tarp!

Curbside Recycling Application

Have you considered the convenience of curbside recycling? The Authority will stop by your home every two (2) weeks and pick up your recyclables for a nominal **annual fee of \$42** (\$3.50 per month). The materials we collect include: aluminum & tin cans, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, paperboard and plastic containers (< 1 gallon in size). (The Authority is under contract with the City of Lock Haven to provide this service to city residents. If you live in the City, please continue to put your recyclables out on your curbside on the regularly scheduled dates. If you need a collection box, call City Hall at 570-893-5900.)

- √ Deliver my real Christmas tree to the landfill free of charge.
- √ Place my used holiday cards and wrapping paper (no foil paper) in the junk mail/office paper compartment at a local recycling drop-off site or for curbside pick-up.
- √ Take my corrugated cardboard boxes to a local recycling drop-off site.

Other Important News!!!

- Clean wood waste, brush & yard waste can be brought to our mulch facility free of charge. The charge for stumps is \$15.00 a ton. This material cannot be painted, stained, treated, or containing metal.
- ◆ The cost for using WTL **Self-Dump** is \$20 for a single load and \$33 for a double or oversize load. The cost to **pick up your recyclables** on a bi-weekly basis will be an annual fee of \$42 (\$3.50 per month).
