**RECYCLE RIGHT CLINTON COUNTY** - The sustainability of our recycling program is dependent on collecting high quality materials without unacceptable materials or trash. We need your help, please do your part!

#### Why Recycling Is Important To All Of Us

In Clinton County our recycling rate has averaged 38% over the last several years. This is great in the grand scheme of things, however, we feel we can do much better. So we are encouraging everyone to ask themselves why is recycling important? Below are a few reasons why recycling is important and why we work so hard to educate and try to provide Clinton County residents with multiple options to recycle.

- When we recycle we are saving natural resources and conserving energy.
- Recycled materials have been refined and processed so manufacturing the second time is cleaner and less energy intensive.
- Reduces air and water pollution.

In Clinton County we recycle aluminum and bi-metal cans, paper, cardboard, newspaper and plastic bottles and jugs. Below are a few examples of how some of these materials contribute to the energy savings in the Commonwealth:

- 1 ton of recycled aluminum cans saves 14,000 kilowatt hours of energy
- 1 ton of recycled steel saves 642 kilowatt hours of energy
- 1 ton of recycled paper saves 4,100 kilowatt hours of energy
- 1 ton of recycled newsprint saves 601 kilowatt hours of energy
- 1 ton of recycled plastic saves 5,744 kilowatt hours of energy



Now to bring that into perspective, in 2020 Clinton County residents and businesses recycled 15,820 tons of materials. This is a significant contribution to the energy savings in our county and the Commonwealth. So we would like to encourage all of the residents in Clinton County to recycle and if you have any questions regarding your options please give us a call.

### Plastic Bag Recycling Reminder

If you use plastic bags to shuffle your recyclables to the drop-off site, please empty your recyclables out of the plastic bag and take the bag with you. Plastic bags can be recycled at several large grocery stores in the County. If you have questions regarding our plastics recycling program, please feel free to call us!





## Curbside Recycling: An Overview



Below you will find a table that describes what we collect via our curbside recycling program. The table also outlines how to prepare the material for recycling and what materials are not accepted. MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED	HOW TO PREPARE FOR RECYCLING	WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED
Newspaper	Clean newspaper (including inserts).	Separate from mixed paper.	Wet or dirty newspaper.
Mixed Paper	Office paper, junk mail, phone books, magazines, catalogs, glossy paper.	Separate from newspaper.	Laminated or coated paper, tissue paper and paper towels.
Paperboard	Clean food boxes, paper towel rolls, shoe boxes, tissue boxes.	Include with mixed paper.	Milk cartons, juice cartons, ice cream containers and similar materials.
Cans	Aluminum, steel, & tin food and beverage cans.	Rinse, leave labels on.	Pie plates, aluminum foil, pesticide or herbicide spray cans.
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Plastic bottles & jugs, coded #1 - #7.	Rinse, remove lids, leave labels on.	Toys, motor oil or chemical bottles.

### **Curbside Recycling Collection Notes:**

- Recycling material should be placed at the curb by 7:00 am on the day of your scheduled pick-up.
- ♦ If you put out more recycling than fits in your blue or green recycling bin, please mark it "Recycling".
- If your pick-up day falls on a major holiday, your recycling material will be picked up on the next business day.

#### **Curbside Recycling Application**

Have you considered the convenience of curbside recycling? The Authority will stop by your home every two (2) weeks and pick up your recyclables for a nominal **annual fee of \$60** (\$5.00 per month). Annual fee will be prorated based on service start time.

The materials we collect include: aluminum & tin cans, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, paperboard and plastic bottles & jugs. (The Authority is under contract with the City of Lock Haven to provide this service to city residents. If you live in the City, please continue to put your recyclables out on your curbside on the regularly scheduled dates. If you need a recycling bin, call City Hall at 570-893-5900.)

#### **Household Hazardous Waste**



Our Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event was held on August 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021. The two day event was open to all Clinton County residents and Lycoming County residents whose township borders Clinton County free of charge. Over 9,300 pounds of material was collected during this event. Most townships participated with over 100 households participating in the free collection event. The Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event was a success and the next event will take place in August of 2023.

#### **Seasonal Recycling**

We are all about recycling no matter what time of the year it is, and we definitely like to take advantage of the holiday seasons. So we are encouraging everyone to gather up



their wrapping paper (no foil paper), paperboard and holiday cards for recycling. These items can be dropped off at any of our local recycling drop-off locations. They can be placed in the bin with office paper and junk mail. We can also accept your cardboard boxes at these locations.

During Christmas most residents enjoy having a real tree in the house. All real

trees can be recycled. To recycle your tree you just come in to the mulch facility and drop it at the brush and yard waste pile and the best part is that it is free of charge. All trees are ground and eventually made into landscape mulch.

### **Electronics Recycling**



The PA Department of Environmental Protection has banned the disposal of certain types of electronics. So the Authority has a program in place for County residents to drop-off electron-

ics for recycling. This service is provided at a nominal charge due to rising operational costs associated with recycling these electronic devices.

Anyone wishing to recycle their "banned" electronic devices will need to deliver the material to the Landfill weigh station located at the end of Landfill Lane. The banned material fees are outlined below:

All Televisions /Computer Monitors - \$30 each Computer Towers/Printers/Scanners - \$10 each Laptops/Tablets—\$10 each Computer Peripherals - \$2 each (no other electronics will be accepted for recycling)

### **Recycling Opportunities for Lock Haven Residents**

The City of Lock Haven provides free curbside recycling for all city residents. Materials should be placed in the green recycling bins, which should be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the day of your scheduled pick-up. Collection days are scheduled according to the recycling zone you live in. You may contact the City to get a refrigerator magnet with the collection schedule. If your collection day falls on a major holiday, your recycling will be picked up on the next business day.

When you have more recyclables than will fit in the green curbside bin, you may use another container, but the container should be clearly marked "Recycling" so the collection crew will know it contains recyclables.

The materials collected at the curb include: aluminum, steel & tin cans, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, paperboard (cereal boxes, six pack holders, etc.) and plastic bottles & jugs.

The City also provides a recycling drop-off site at the corner of East Park and Myrtle Street for the convenience of City Residents. In addition to the materials collected at the curb, corrugated cardboard is also collected at the drop-off site. Please remember to breakdown your boxes and remove any "non-corrugated cardboard" material from inside the box.

City commercial establishments and multi-family dwellings (4 units or more) are required by state law and city ordinance to recycle a minimum of three of the listed materials. Contact the City or the Wayne Township Landfill for assistance with your commercial recycling program.
